Now, there is a state-of-the-art archives in underground storage space on the river bluff of the West bank of the University.

Super Croatians

Three-time Super Bowl Coach Bill Belichick has Croatian roots. Putting speculation to rest once and for all, it has emerged that New England Patriots head coach Bill Belichick is of Croatian heritage. Belichick's grandfather, Ivan Bilicic, came to the United States in 1897 from the Karlovac region and his grandmother, Mary Barkovic, arrived in 1898, also from near Karlovac. The couple settled in Pennsylvania. Belichick's father, Stephen Nickolas Belichick (Bilicic) was born in 1919 and in 1924, the family moved to Struthers, a suburb of Youngstown, OH. Ivan Bilicic spoke six languages despite not having any schooling. He worked at Pittsburgh Steel and was a butcher and a gardener on the side. When he applied for his citizenship papers, an immigration official suggested he change his name to "White". Bilicic refused.

Ivan Bilicic and Mary Barkovic had one daughter and four sons. Stephen (father of Coach Bill) was their third son. He graduated from Struthers High School in 1937 and Case Western Reserve University in 1941. He went on to play professional football for the Detroit Lions with Andy Runovich from Indiana University. Steve married Jeannette Munn (Bill's mother), a Spanish and French professor at Hiram College where Stephen was the head football/head basketball/head track/head golf and physical education coach. Stephen Belichick is a member of the CFU and his nieces have visited Karlovac as well as relatives in the villages of Draganic, Lazanic and Barkovic. They have been active in the Croatian communities in Pennsylvania and Ohio.

Stephen Belichick and Jeannette Munn had one child, a son Bill, who was born in Nashville in 1952 when Stephen was coaching at Vanderbilt University. William Stephen Belichick, "Bill," is a three-time Super Bowl Coach and the rest is history.

Northwestern University: Ivan Tolic, Davor Duyancic and Vedran Vukusic, all came to the United States after being recruited to play basketball at Northwestern University. The three Croats are roommates from Split. Besides their athletic skills on the hard court, which have proved beneficial to the Wildcats' team, the three have also brought with them much of their own culture as well.

Andrew Bogut Profile: Born November 28, 1984 to Croatian parents but has spent his life in Australia. He played basketball for Utah in the NCAA, where he played center, a suitable position for his 7 foot 0, 240 pound frame. Bogut is lethal in the paint, can adapt to almost any situation and was probably the best rebounder in the NCAA last year. He will almost undoubtedly go number one in the NBA draft.

Ivan Ljubicic: The 25 Year old Ljubicic beat Andy Roddick of the United States clinching the first-round Davis Cup tie for Croatia. in March in California. Croatia seemed to have almost as many fans as the US team. Southern California is home to a large number of transplanted Croats.




