The Croatian people know fully well the consequences of War and their hearts and hopes for world peace are with us also.



Did you realize that it has been seven years since the Consulate opened in Minnesota? It has had a great impact for the Croatian Community. Boris Miksic takes his role as Consul General very seriously. It's major role is in educating and promoting greater understanding of Croatia and its relationship with Minnesota. We are also creating friendships and family relationships.

The White Bear Consul is a model for consulates that have since opened in the United States, including Chicago, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, New Orleans and Seattle. The White Bear Consulate is staffed by volunteers 24 hours a day, responding to needs that occur. We also send literature requested by people who are going to travel to Croatia and answer any questions they may have regarding visas and travel.

Boris continues to build ties between Croatia and Minnesota, two places he does not see as all that different. "I feel American just as much as Croatian," Miksic says. "I love both countries. They're both my homelands."

Croatian Olympiad

A Crystal Globe is definitely in Janica Kostelic's hands! Janica Kostelic became Croatia's first triple Olympic champion and first Winter Games champion, ever, after winning three gold medals at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. In February, 2002, she won the Olympic Gold in the combined race, her second gold in slalom and her third in the giant slalom. With her silver medal in the super-G, Janica became the first alpine skier ever to win four medals at a single Olympic Winter Games.

Janica became Croatia's hero, conquering our hearts with her warm story of hard work and family dedication leading to the success of winning four medals and breaking the Olympic Records.

- new thematic maps on population, ethnolinguistic distribution, administrative structure, education, prison camps, Catholic churches, and Orthodox churches in the 20th century

- a comprehensive bibliography and index (over 5,000 entries in 27 languages)
